On Monday, December 9, Bartlett Sher will direct a one-night-only reunion concert of LCT's Tony Award-winning 2008 production of *Rodgers & Hammerstein's SOUTH PACIFIC*, starring original cast members Kelli O'Hara, Paulo Szot, Matthew Morrison, Danny Burstein, Loretta Ables Sayre, Sean Cullen, Victor Hawks, Luka Kain, Li Jun Li, Laurissa Romain, Skipp Sudduth, and Noah Weisberg. The concert will take place on the stage of the Vivian Beaumont Theater (150 W. 65th St.), accompanied by a 30-piece orchestra conducted by Music Director Ted Sperling. The Gala evening will support Lincoln Center Theater's productions and education programs and is part of LCT's 40th Anniversary Season Celebration.

LCT's 2024 *SOUTH PACIFIC* Gala Co-Chairs are Sandra and Howard I. Hoffen and Stellene Volandes. The Gala will honor the Claire Tow, Mitzi E. Newhouse, and Vivian Beaumont families; the descendants of the three extraordinary women for whom LCT's stages are named.

Lincoln Center Theater's 2008 revival of *Rodgers & Hammerstein's SOUTH PACIFIC* ran from April 3, 2008, through August 22, 2010, at the Vivian Beaumont Theater. It marked the first Broadway revival of the Pulitzer Prize-winning musical since its debut in 1949. Based on James Michener's Pulitzer Prize-winning book *Tales of the South Pacific*, *Rodgers & Hammerstein's SOUTH PACIFIC* has music by Richard Rodgers, lyrics by Oscar Hammerstein II and a book by Oscar Hammerstein II and Joshua Logan.

Set on a tropical island during World War II, the musical tells the sweeping romantic story of two couples -- US Navy nurse Ensign Nellie Forbush & French plantation owner Emile de Becque

and Navy Airman Lt. Joseph Cable & Liat, a local young woman -- and how their happiness is threatened by the realities of the war and by their own prejudices. Complete casting for the reunion concert will be announced soon.

Benefit tickets range in price from \$1,500 to \$10,000 and include a post-show Cocktail Reception with the cast of *SOUTH PACIFIC* at the Metropolitan Opera House, where the menu will be curated by Angie Mar of Restaurant Le B. 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BARTLETT SHER is a Tony award-winner who has been described by The New York Times as one of America's "most original and exciting directors." His production of Aaron Sorkin's adaptation of To Kill a Mockingbird on Broadway is the best-selling American play in Broadway history. He has been a resident director at Lincoln Center Theater since 2008, where his work includes Lerner & Loewe's Camelot, Corruption, The Light in the Piazza, Awake and Sing!, South Pacific, Joe Turner's Come and Gone, Golden Boy, The King & I, and the 2017 Tony-winning Best Play Oslo, My Fair Lady. His other works on Broadway and in the West End include Pictures from Home, The Bridges of Madison County and Fiddler on the Roof. Bart has also directed several operas, including Rigoletto (Berlin, Metropolitan Opera); Roméo et Juliette (Metropolitan Opera, Salzburg, Milan, Chicago); Faust (Baden Baden); Two Boys (ENO, Metropolitan Opera); Il Barbiere di Siviglia (Baden Baden, Metropolitan Opera), Otello, Les Contes d'Hoffmann, Le Comte Ory, L'Elisir d'Amore (Metropolitan Opera); Mourning Becomes Electra (Seattle Opera, City Opera). He will direct the world premiere of The Amazing Adventures of Kavalier and Clay for the Met in their 2025-2026 season. His film of Oslo starring Ruth Wilson & Andrew Scott premiered on HBO in 2021 and was nominated for two Emmy Awards and won a Critics Choice Award. Bart recently mounted a hit revival of Kiss Me, Kate at the Barbican in London. His upcoming work includes a stage adaptation of the movie musical La La Land.

TED SPERLING will be returning to Lincoln Center Theater this season with *Floyd Collins*, his eighth production with LCT over the span of over thirty years. He won the Tony and Drama Desk Awards for his work on *The Light in the Piazza* and has been nominated for five Grammy Awards and the Emmy Award. Artistic Director of MasterVoices for the past ten years, he has led programs on all the major stages of New York City and is also a guest conductor with major symphonies throughout the country. He is training the next generation of Broadway musicians at NYU. www.tedsperling.net

KELLI O'HARA has been nominated for 8 Tony Awards, winning for the Lincoln Center Theater production of *The King and I*. She is also an Emmy, Olivier, and 2-time Grammy nominated artist who made

history as the first to crossover from Broadway to Opera with her Metropolitan Opera debut in 2015. Her solo concerts take her across the world. Selected film/TV credits include: "The Gilded Age," "The Accidental Wolf," "13 Reasons Why," "Masters of Sex," Sex and the City 2 and Martin Scorsese's The Key to Reserva. Upcoming: Season 3 of "The Gilded Age."

PAULO SZOT. Born in São Paulo, Brazil. Broadway debut in *South Pacific* at LCT (Tony Award for Best Actor in a Musical, Drama Desk, Outer Critics Circle, Theatre World awards). Additional theater includes *South Pacific* (West End, Laurence Olivier Award nomination), Bernstein's *Mass, Candide, My Fair Lady*, *Evita, Chicago* and currently in & *Juliet* (Broadway). Mr. Szot was the first Brazilian male voice to sing at The Metropolitan Opera. In 2023 he completed his 10th season with The Met (debut with Shostakovich's *The Nose* in 2010). Also performed at Paris Opera, Real de Madrid, Alla Scalla di Milano, Bayerische Staatsoper, Marseille Opera, Opera di Roma, Barcelona Liceo, Monte Carlo Opera, Sydney Opera; also with The New York Philharmonic, Chicago Symphony, American Pops Orchestra, NY Pops Orchestra, Philadelphia Orchestra, and Warsaw Filharmonic.

MATTHEW MORRISON a Tony, Emmy and Golden Globe award nominee, his most recent Broadway credit is starring as J.M Barrie in Finding Neverland (Drama Desk nom, Broadway.com Audience Choice Award). Additional Broadway includes Footloose, Link Larkin in Hairspray, The Light in the Piazza (Tony Award nom), 10 Million Miles (DD nom) and South Pacific. TV includes Mr. Schuester on "Glee," U.S. Attorney Conor Fox on "The Good Wife," "Grey's Anatomy" and hosted and narrated the PBS special entitled "Oscar Hammerstein II: Out of My Dreams."
